New Testament Reading

1 Thessalonians 2.1-8

And you yourselves know, sisters and brothers, that our coming among you was not without effect. We had, as you know, been given rough treatment at Philippi, and it was our God who gave us the courage to proclaim the Good News to you in the face of stiff opposition. We don't preach because of impure motives or deceit or any sort of trickery; rather, it was God who decided that we are fit to be entrusted with the Good News, and when we are speaking, we're trying to please not mortals, but God, who can read our inmost thoughts.

You know very well—and we can swear it before God—that never at any time has our speech been simple flattery or a cover for trying to get money; nor have we ever looked for any special honor from you or from anyone else—even though we could have imposed ourselves on you as apostles of Christ. On the contrary, while we were with you we were as gentle as any nursing mother caring for her little ones. so well disposed were we toward you, in fact, that we were willing to share with you not only the Good News, but our very lives as well—you had become that dear to us.

Gospel Reading

When the Pharisees heard that Jesus had left the Sadducees speechless, they gathered together, and one of them, an expert on the Law, attempted to trick Jesus with this question: "Teacher, which commandment of the Law is the greatest?"

Jesus answered: "You must love the Most High God with all your heart, with all your soul and with all your mind. That is the greatest and first commandment. The second is like it: You must love your neighbor as yourself. On these two

commandments the whole Law is based-and the Prophets as well."

While the Pharisees were gathered around him, Jesus asked them this question: "What do you think about the Messiah? Whose descendant is the Messiah?" They said, "David's." Then Jesus asked, "Then how is it that David, inspired by the Spirit, calls the Messiah 'Sovereign'? For he says, 'The Most High said to my Sovereign,

"Sit at my right hand until I place your enemies under your foot."" "If David calls the Messiah 'Sovereign,' how can the Messiah be a descendant of David?"

No one could reply, and from that day on no one dared ask him any more questions.



Now Testament Reading After the Ascension, by George MacLeod There is a very old legend—and all legends that persist speak truth— concerning the return of Jesus to heaven after his Ascension. It is said that the angel Gabriel met him at the gates of the city. "Sovereign, this is a great salvation that you have wrought!," said the angel. But Jesus only said, "Yes." "What plans do you have for carrying on the work? How are all to know what you have done?" asked Gabriel. "I left Mary and Martha and Lydia, Peter and James and John to tell their friends, their friends to tell their friends, till all the world should know." "But my Sovereign," said Gabriel, "suppose Lydia is too busy with her purple fabric business, or Martha with her home duties, or Peter too busy with the nets, or the friends too occupied, and they forget to tell their friends—then what?"

Jesus did not answer at once; then he said in that quite wonderful voice: "I have not made other plans. I am counting on them."

WILDFIRES Please pray for those impacted as several wildfire have engulfed our state. Among those are the Cameron Peak fire which has consumed more than 200k acres; the Calwood fire which started on Saturday and at the time of this writing had burned more than 10k acres, damaged at least 26 homes, is 24% contained and is the largest fire ever recorded in Boulder county; the Lefthand Canyon fire, which is 43% contained; the Williams Fork Fire in Grand County, which has burned 14k acres and is 30% contained; East Troublesome fire, also in Grand County, that went from burning 24k acres to 125k acres overnight and forced evacuations for the entire town of Grand Lake and portions of Estes Park. Please keep **Pastor Paul and Mary Johnson** and **Nan and Don Graber** of Mountain Community Mennonite in

Palmer Lake in your prayers as it is believed that both of those families have lost their homes to this fire. (above stated information was accurate as of 10/25/20)

- ~MASK ASK, MCC is responding to a request from people on the Northern Cheyenne reservation in southeastern Montana for cloth face masks to help stop the spread of COVID-19. If you would like to sew masks, please use the following guidelines: adult sized; at least 2 layers of good quality cotton fabric; (solid colors preferred) elastic ear loops; nose wire/filter pockets optional. Please ship purchased or completed masks to the MCC Central States Material Resources Center (Attn: Kate Mast) at 121 E. 30th St., North Newton, KS 67117, or drop off in the 24 hour donation room at MCC by November 15th They will all be collected and transported to Montana in time for the winter season.
