Parker Palmer, Let Your Life Speak

"Winter here in the Upper Midwest is a demanding season - and not everyone appreciates the discipline. It is a season when death's victory can seem supreme: few creatures stir, plants do not visibly grow, and nature feels like our enemy. ... In the Upper Midwest, newcomers often receive a classic piece of wintertime advice: "The winters will drive you crazy until you learn to get out into them." ... Our inward winters take many forms - failure, betrayal, depression, death. But every one of them, in my experience, yields to the same advice: "The winters will drive you crazy until you learn to get out into them." Until we enter boldly into the fears we most want to avoid, those fears will dominate our lives. But when we walk directly into them - protected from frostbite by the warm garb of friendship or inner discipline or spiritual guidance - we can learn what they have to teach us. Then we discover once again that the cycle of the seasons is trustworthy and life-giving, even in the most dismaying season of all."

Anabaptist Dictionary of the Bible Phase 1 Nears Completion: The first phase of the Anabaptist Dictionary of the Bible (ADB) is nearing completion. This free online project at the center of biblical interpretation and Anabaptist thought is adding article 49 toward a goal to cover all 66 books in the Bible. As described on the website, the purpose of this project is "to reflect (and to reflect critically on) an Anabaptist approach to the reading of the Bible." The Anabaptist Dictionary of the Bible is intended to serve those within Anabaptist traditions as well as to be a respectful conversation partner with those in other Christian traditions.
