

A Moment for All Ages

New Testament Reading

James 1.1-17

From James, a servant of God and our Savior Jesus the Anointed, To the twelve tribes of the diaspora: Greetings. Think of it as pure joy, my sisters and brothers, whenever you

face trials of any sort. You understand that your faith is put to the test only to make you patient, but patience too has its practical results—it's to make you fully mature and lacking in nothing. If you lack wisdom, ask for it from God, who gives generously and ungrudgingly to all, and it will be given to you. But you must ask in faith, never doubting, for the doubter is like the surf tossed and driven by the wind. People like this must not expect to receive anything from God, for they are devious and erratic in all they do.

Let sisters and brothers who are in humble circumstances take pride in their high position, and let rich people take pride in their lowliness, for they will disappear "like the flowers of the field." When the sun comes up with its scorching heat and parches the meadow, the flowers wither and the meadow's loveliness disappears. Just so will the rich people wither away amid their many concerns.

Blessed are those who persevere under trial! Once their worth has been proven, they will receive the crown of life that God has promised to the faithful. No one who is tempted is free to say, "I am being tempted by God." God, who is not touched by evil, tempts no one. Those who are tempted are attracted and seduced by their own wrong desires. Then the desires conceive and give birth to sin, and when that sin is fully grown, it too has a child—death.

Make no mistake about this, my dear sisters and brothers: every worthwhile gift, every genuine benefit comes from above, descending from the Creator of the heavenly luminaries, who cannot change and is never in shadow.


