Hebrew Scripture Reading

Jeremiah 31.7-9

For thus says the Eternal One: Sing aloud with joy for Jacob! Hail the Head of Nations! Make your praises heard, and say, 'Eternal One, save your people, Israel's remnant!' For I will bring them from the lands of the north and gather them from the ends of the earth—the blind and the lame will be among them, along with expectant mothers and women in labor. They will return in vast numbers.

They will return weeping and praying. I will guide them in my mercy. I will lead them beside streams of water, along level ground where they will not stumble. For I am forever a mother and father to Israel, and Ephraim is my firstborn."

Gospel Reading

Mark 10.46-52

Jesus and his friends came to Jericho. As they were leaving with a sizable crowd, Bartimaeus, a blind beggar, the son of Timaeus, was sitting alongside the road. When he learned that it was Jesus the Nazarene, he began to shout: "You son of David, Jesus, have mercy on me!" And many kept yelling at Bartimaeus to shut up, but he shouted all the louder, "You son of David, have mercy on me!"

Jesus paused and said, "Tell him to come over here!" They called to the blind man, "Be brave, get up, he's calling you!" So Bartimaeus threw off his cloak, and jumped to his feet, and went over to Jesus. In response Jesus said, "What do you want me to do for you?"

The blind man said to him, "Rabbi, I want to see again!" And Jesus said to him, "Be on your way, your trust has cured you." And right away Bartimaeus regained his sight and started following Jesus on the road.

Helen Keller from Light in My Darkness

[T]hose who have been mentally blinded "in the gradual furnace of the world" can, and must, be pressed to look for new capabilities within themselves and work out new ways to happiness. They may even resent faith that expects nobler things from them. They may say in effect, "I will be content if you take me for what I am—dull, or mean, or hard, or selfish." But it is an affront to them and to the eternal dignity of humanity to acquiesce to this request.... How little we know ourselves! We need limitations and temptations to open our inner selves, dispel our ignorance, tear off disguises, throw down old idols, and destroy false standards. Only by such rude awakenings can we be led to dwell in a place where we are less cramped, less hindered by the ever-insistent external world. Only then do we discover a new capacity and appreciation of goodness and beauty and truth.
