ROCKY MOUNTAIN MENNONITE RELIEF SALE: Relief Sale Preliminary Report:

Thanks to all the folks who supported the sale in the new location. Special thanks to those who volunteered to help with the auction. Total-Last year's auction was exceptionally large, and the total was higher than this year. But the 2022 totals for the two auctions and donations were \$57,230.00 so 2024 exceeds by a significant amount. Bidder registration for 2024 was 288 which compares to the 10-year average registration of 197. We do not have any figures from the booths at this point, so the figures shared here are only the result of what took place during the auctions. Figures for 2024: General Auction-\$13,763.50; Quilt Auction-\$45,725.00; Donations-\$11,529.95

ECOLOGY TIP: Residential fires are more common in winter, so it is important that all your smoke detectors work. Check them monthly and replace the batteries as needed. You should also consider installing a carbon monoxide detector to avoid inadvertently trapping the toxic gas in your home. This weekend with the time change is a great time to test and change out any batteries for fire alarms and carbon monoxide detectors. Let's do all we can to protect God's earth from fires.
