Gospel Reading

The angel Gabriel was sent from God to a town in Galilee called Nazareth, to a young woman named Mary. Upon arriving, the angel said to Mary, "**Rejoice, highly favored one! God is with you! Blessed are you among women!**"

Mary was deeply troubled by these words and wondered what the angel's greeting meant. The angel went on to say to her, "Don't be afraid, Mary. You have found favor with God. You'll conceive and bear a son and give him the name Jesus— 'Creator Sets Free.' His dignity will be great, and he will be called the Son of the Most High... and his reign will never end.

"Know too that Elizabeth, your kinswoman, has conceived a child in her old age; she who was thought to be infertile is now in her sixth month. Nothing is impossible with God." Mary said, "I am the servant of God. Let it be done to me as you say." With that, the angel left her.

Within a few days Mary set out and hurried to the hill country to the town of Judah, where she entered Zechariah's house and greeted Elizabeth. As soon as Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the child leaped in her womb and Elizabeth was filled with Holy spirit. In a loud voice she exclaimed, **"Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb!** But why am I so favored, that the mother of God's Anointed One should come to me? The moment your greeting reached my ears, the child in my womb leaped for joy.

Mary said: "My soul magnifies God, and my spirit rejoices in you, my Savior. For you have looked with favor upon your lowly servant, and from this day forward all generations will call me blessed.

For you, Almighty God, have done great things for me, and holy is your Name. Your mercy reaches from age to age for those who reverence you. You have shown strength with your arm; you have scattered the proud in their conceit; you have deposed the mighty from their thrones and raised the lowly to high places. You have filled the hungry with good things, while you have sent the rich away empty. You have come to the aid of your people, mindful of your mercy— the promise you made to our ancestors— to Sarah and Abraham and their descendants forever."

~ IN OUR COMMUNITY~

<u>**THE FAMILY IN CRISIS FUND**</u> was established about 20 years ago through this church to help the people of South Africa. While we were there, we used the funds to help with medications

that people needed, school fees, food for families and support the love of Christ children's home. This home takes in abandoned babies and tries to reunite with family members, adoption in South Africa or International adoption (rare). TLC has now expanded their role into not only taking in abandoned babies/children but working with mothers so they can keep their babies. This is done through trauma therapy, teaching them skills to raise children and skills for employment. Some of the mothers live on location to learn and grow for up to 3 years. Others are from the local community in nearby townships. TLC also has a feeding scheme and also hires local people from the township to help care for the babies (vetted by child social services), growing a large vegetable garden, chickens and maintenance. Their electricity is about 85% solar. Please consider giving to the Family in Crisis fund through the BMC website or write a check to BMC with family in crisis in the memo. *Thank you! ~The Firnhabers*
