

New Testament Reading

from Ephesians 4

As a prisoner for the Lord, then, I urge you to live a life worthy of the calling you have received. Be completely humble and gentle; be patient, bearing with one another in love. Make every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace.

Then we will no longer be infants, tossed back and forth by the waves, and blown here and there by every wind of teaching and by the cunning and craftiness of people in their deceitful scheming. Instead, speaking the truth in love, we will grow to become in every respect the mature body of him who is the head, that is, the Anointed One.

So I declare and testify together with the Anointed that you must stop living the kind of life the world lives. Their minds are empty, they have no understanding, they are alienated from the life of God—all because they have hardened their hearts

Do not let any unwholesome talk come out of your mouths, but only what is helpful for building others up according to their needs, that it may benefit those who listen. Get rid of all bitterness, rage and anger, brawling and slander, along with every form of malice. Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as God has forgiven you in the Anointed One.

Gospel Reading

Matthew 5.43-48

Jesus said, "You're familiar with the old written law, 'Love your friend,' and its unwritten companion, 'Hate your enemy.' I'm challenging that. I'm telling you to love your enemies. Let them bring out the best in you, not the worst. When someone gives you a hard time, respond with the supple moves of prayer, for then you are working out of your true selves, your God-created selves. This is what God does. God gives the best—the sun to warm and the rain to nourish—to everyone, regardless: the good and bad, the nice and nasty. If all you do is love the lovable, do you expect a bonus? Anybody can do that. If you simply say hello to those who greet you, do you expect a medal? Any run-of-the-mill human does that.

"In a word, what I'm saying is, Grow up. You're part of God's kindom – now live like it. Live out your God-created identity. Live generously and graciously toward others, the way God lives toward you."

Now Testament Reading

Yvette Erasmus, How to Transform Enemy Images

Enemy images are fixed, rigid ideas we have about others. Anytime we think about "those people" as narcissistic, privileged, toxic, American, or a long list of other identity labels, we run the risk of reducing their essential humanity into a static enemy image.

These labels are grounded in a deep negative judgment we hold about a person or group or people, and these fear-based judgments also block our ability to empathize with or connect to them as another human being. As we subtly dehumanize others, turning them into an object rather than a subject through our language and labels, we also find it easier to be unkind, judgmental, violent or harmful to them because – unconsciously – we either want to get rid of them or break through to them, and believe that force and hurt are the best tools for this.

Dehumanization is one of the primary instruments of both psychological and physical violence. We turn people into objects so that we feel free to harm, coerce, and exploit them for selfish purposes.



- ~for **Toni and her husband**. He, along with half a million other Cuban, Haitian, Venezuelan, and Nicaraguan immigrants, has lost his legal status to be in the US. He must leave the US by 4/24, unless his status can be changed. Prayers for all people affected by the daily upheaval to our society. Also prayers for peace and direction: 68 years ago, Toni's dad dug the foundation to our family home—the day I was born. My husband and I still live in our family house, part of my mom's estate. It is now under contract and the closing may be fast-tracked. We had planned on purchasing a house together, but with all the unknowns, I may be moving alone to a rental.
- ~for Carter McKay-Epp who lost his job due to not having federal funding.
- ~for the **families impacted by the shooting at King Soopers** on March 22, 2021 and their continued healing.
- ~for the family and friends of **Hossam Shabat**, a steadfast journalist, who Israel assassinated. He was targeted and murdered by an airstrike which hit his car in the eastern part of Beit Lahiya, northern Gaza. Shabat was a highly dedicated journalist at only 23 years old, who continued his work despite being targeted and injured in an earlier attack by Israeli occupation forces in 2024. He remained in northern Gaza throughout the heightened siege and perilous invasion and attacks by Israeli forces, which sought to drive out all of its residents. He was one of the few journalists, alongside Anas Al-Sharif, who remained in the north throughout the genocide war.
- ~for **Pastor Bob Bates** is in the intensive care unit in Lafayette, Colorado. A call for prayers from the Western Plains District of the Brethren Church as he recovers.
