Michael Sattler, Trial Testimony, 1527

If you do not repent and turn from your ways, you will one day regret what you do now. Yet I do not stand here in fear, for I know the One in whom I have placed my trust. The Almighty God has called us to witness to the truth of Christ's kingdom—a kingdom not ruled by the sword, but by love; not established through force, but through faithfulness. You may take this body, but you cannot touch the soul. My hope is not in this life but in the life to come, and I will not waver in the path my Savior has set before me.

I go willingly into the hands of my Lord, for Christ himself has shown us the way. He did not strike back when struck, nor curse those who condemned him, but opened his arms in love—even for his enemies. This is the way of Jesus, the way of the cross. And so, I pray that you who stand in judgment may yet come to know the mercy of God. As Christ forgave, so do I. May the will of God be done.
