# A Moment for All Ages

# New Testament Reading

from Acts 16.16-34

Once when we were going to prayer, we met a woman who was a slave and who was possessed by a spirit of divination. She made a great deal of money for her owners through its fortune telling. She began to follow Paul and the rest of us, shouting, "These are faithful followers of the Most High God, who proclaim to you the way of salvation!" She did this for many days. Finally, one day Paul lost his temper, and turned around and said to the spirit, "In the name of Jesus Christ I command you to leave this woman!" It left her that moment.

When her owners saw that their profitable operation was now hopelessly dead, they seized Paul and Silas and dragged them before the authorities in the public square and said, "These people are disturbing the peace by advocating practices which are unlawful for us Romans to accept or practice."

The crowd joined in the attack on them, and the magistrates stripped them and ordered them to be flogged. They were whipped many times and thrown into the innermost cell of the prison, their feet chained to a stake. The jailer was told to keep a close watch on them.

About midnight, Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns to God as the other prisoners listened. Suddenly a severe earthquake shook the place, rocking the prison to its foundation. Immediately all the doors flew open, and everyone's chains were pulled loose. When the jailer woke up and found the doors wide open, he drew a sword and was about to commit suicide, presuming that the prisoners had escaped. But Paul shouted, "Don't harm yourself! We're all still here."

The jailer called for a light, then rushed in and fell trembling at the feet of Paul and Silas, and led them out and asked them, "What must I do to be saved?"

They answered, "Believe in Jesus the Savior, and you will be saved—you and everyone in your household." They proceeded to preach the word of God to the jailer and his whole household. At that late hour of the night, he took them in and bathed their wounds; then he and

the whole household were baptized. He led them up into his house, spread a table before them, and the whole family joyfully celebrated their newfound faith in God.

# Gospel Reading

John 17.20-26

Jesus said, "I'm praying not only for my disciples, but also for those who will believe in me because of them and their witness about me. The goal is for all of them to become one heart and mind— just as you, Abba God, are in me and I in you, so they might be one heart and mind with us. Then the world might believe that you, in fact, sent me. The honor and presence you've shared with me, I've shared with them, so they'll be as unified and together as we are— I in them and you in me. Then they'll be mature in this oneness, and give the world evidence that you've sent me and loved them in the same way you've loved me.

"Abba, I want those you gave me to be with me, right where I am, so they can see the fullness of all you've revealed through me, the love and purpose you gave me before there ever was a world. Righteous One, the world has never known you, but I have known you, and these disciples know that you sent me on this mission. I have made your very being known to them—who you are and what you do— and continue to make it known, so that your love for me might be in them exactly as I am in them.

## Now Testament Reading

Marcus Borg, Why be a Christian?

"So why be Christian? The Christian tradition is familiar; it is "home" for me. I was born into it and grew up in it. Its stories, language, music, and ethos are familiar. It nurtured me, even as I have had to unlearn some of what I was taught.

In adulthood, I have grown to appreciate its extraordinary richness: its antiquity and wisdom; the beauty of language and music and forms of worship; its passion for compassion and justice; the sheer goodness of its most remarkable lives. Its worship nourishes me; its hymns move me; its scripture and theology engage my imagination and thought; its practices shape me. For me, it mediates the good, the true, and the beautiful; and through all of these, it mediates the sacred. It is for me a sacrament of the sacred.

And it is home. It is familiar to me in a way that no other religion could ever become. Christianity is "home" like no other tradition could be. For me, the ethos of Christianity—its vision and way of life, its scripture, worship, language, music, thought, vision, and so forth—is home.

# ~ IN THE LARGER COMMUNITY ~

**ECOLOGY TIP**: These days when we might feel helpless to reverse all the changes we see in the news, remember that we can make a difference with small acts. Hand washing dishes in two basins, one for soapy water, and one for rinsing only takes a couple of gallons of water. By hand washing dishes under running water, it's easy to run more than 20 gallons for a load of dishes. In comparison, most modern dishwashers use 4 to 6 gallons per cycle, so you can see that washing by hand (2 gallons at the most) is the method which saves the most water. Most dishwashers are also strong enough that you don't need to rinse plates ahead of time, unless there's enough food waste to scrape off into the compost.
