Hebrew Scripture Reading

Genesis 15.1-6

After these events, word of the Eternal One came to Abram in a vision, "Don't be afraid, Abram. I am your protector. Your reward will be very great."

New Testament Reading

from Hebrews 11

Faith is the reality of all that is hoped for and the proof of all that is unseen. Because of faith, our ancestors were approved by God. By faith, we understand that the world was created by the word from God, and that what is visible came into being through the invisible. By faith, Sarah and Abraham obeyed when they were called and went off to the place they were to receive as a heritage; they went forth, moreover, not knowing where they were going.

By faith, Sarah and Abraham lived in the promised land as resident immigrants, dwelling with their children and grandchildren, who were heirs of the same promise— for they were looking forward to the city with foundations, whose designer and maker is God. All of them died in faith. They didn't obtain what had been promised but saw and welcomed it from afar. By accepting that they were strangers and exiles on the earth, they showed that they were looking for a country of their own.

If they had been thinking of the country from which they had come, they'd have been able to return to it. But they were searching for a better country, a place of justice and peace—a heaven!
