## A Moment for All Ages

## New Testament Reading

1 Thessalonians 5.14-24

We urge you, kindred, to warn the idlers, cheer up the fainthearted, support the weak, and be patient with everyone. Make sure that no one repays one evil with another. Always seek what is good for each other—and for all people.

Rejoice always, pray constantly, and give thanks for everything—for this is God's will for you in the Anointed Jesus. Don't stifle the Spirit; don't despise the prophetic gift. But test everything and accept only what is good. Avoid any semblance of evil.

May the God of peace make you perfect in holiness. May you be preserved whole and complete—spirit, soul, and body—irreproachable at the coming of our Savior Jesus the Anointed. The One who calls us is trustworthy: God will make sure it comes to pass.

## Gospel Reading

Luke 15.1-10

Meanwhile, the tax collectors and the "sinners" were all gathering around Jesus to listen to his teaching, at which the Pharisees and the religious scholars murmured, "This person welcomes sinners and eats with them!"

Jesus then addressed this parable to them: "Who among you, having a hundred sheep and losing one of them, doesn't leave the ninety-nine in the open pasture and search for the lost one until it's found? And finding it, you put the sheep on your shoulders in jubilation. Once home, you invite friends and neighbors in and say to them, 'Rejoice with me! I've found my lost sheep!' I tell you, in the same way there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who has a change of heart than over ninety-nine virtuous people who have no need to change their hearts.

"What householder, who has ten silver coins and loses one, doesn't light a lamp and sweep the house in a diligent search until she finds what she had lost? And when it is found, the householder calls in her friends and neighbors and says, 'Rejoice with me! I've found the silver coin I lost!' I tell you, there will be the same kind of joy before the angels of God when one sinner has a change of heart."

**DECLARATION OF RESPECT:** The second pilot of the Declaration of Respect, began on **August 11, 2025**, in partnership with the Boulder Police Department. The program engages 20 officers over a three-month period, building on the success of the first pilot and representing an important milestone for the Declaration of Respect as an **independent nonprofit organization founded after the death of George Floyd**. The Boulder pilot provides a model that can be adapted for other police departments across Colorado and the United States, emphasizing **trust**, **accountability**, **and respectful policing** through officer reflection, scenario-based training, and community collaboration. "IF I COULD STAY/ SI PUDIERA QUEDARME" – The documentary of Jeanette Vizguerra and Ingrid Latorre, and their 5-year journey in church sanctuary, will be shown Monday, September 26, 6:00pm, at the Boulder Valley UU Fellowship, 1241 Ceres Dr, Lafayette.

**ECOLOGY TIP**: The University of Colorado has begun eliminating all single-use plastics from its campus beverage services. The sustainability department says that in one year it will prevent 325,000 plastic water bottles from being used at Folsom Field. CU Boulder is transitioning to aluminum or glass bottles for pop or water on campus, after signing a deal with PepsiCo, which includes no exceptions. Glass and aluminum are more easily turned back into glass and aluminum containers, while plastic is usually "downcycled" into other products which require new materials. If a large organization like CU Boulder can take these steps, what can we as households and small churches do to reduce our carbon footprint?
