

New Testament Reading

2 Timothy 1.6-14

759

I want to remind you to fan into flame the gift of God, which is in you through the laying on of my hands. For God didn't give us a spirit of timidity, but a spirit of power, of love, of self-discipline.

So don't be ashamed to give your testimony about the Anointed One, and don't be ashamed of me, the Anointed One's prisoner. But join with me in suffering for the Gospel by the power of God, who has saved us and called us to a holy life—not because of anything we have done, but because of God's own purpose and grace. 

~ IN THE LARGER COMMUNITY ~

ECOLOGY TIP: It is now against the law for restaurants in Colorado to use styrofoam, so many businesses have bought compostable take home containers. Unfortunately, A1 Organics has limited what we can compost to only food scraps and yard waste, so we have no place to compost these containers. However, you can still compliment the restaurant for providing compostable items, since their manufacturing is much greener than that of plastic or styrofoam. Ultimately, they will biodegrade in the landfill, whereas styrofoam never will. And of course, the most ecological thing to do is to bring your own containers to take home the delicious leftovers!
