A Moment for All Ages

Gospel Reading

Luke 14.16-26

Jesus responded, "A landowner was giving a large dinner and sent out many invitations. At dinnertime, the landowner instructed an aide to say to those invited, 'Come to the feast, everything is ready.' But they began to excuse themselves, each and every one. The first one said to the aide, 'I've just bought some land, and I need to go out and inspect it. Please send my regrets.' Another said, 'I've just bought five yoke of oxen, and I need to go out and test them. Please excuse me.' A third said, 'I've just gotten married, so of course I can't come.'

"The aide returned and reported all this to the landowner. The landowner became angry and said to the aide, 'Go into town, into the streets and alleys, and bring in those who are poor or crippled, and those who are blind or lame.' 

CARE PACKAGES TO ROCA: "I was a prisoner and you visited me." You may not be able to visit a detention center in San Antonio, but you can still do something to make a difference for our friends caught up in the immigration system there. Roca de Refugio Mennonite Church is inviting the rest of the conference to provide care packages for families who have a loved one in detention or in the deportation process. Possible items include: For adults: Cozy socks, cookies, hot chocolate, tea, mugs, candles, face masks, lotions, journal and pen, notes of support, etc. For kids: Stuffed animals, cozy socks, soft blanket, candy, cookies, coloring book/notebook and pen, activities book (with no or little English), etc. Pastor Randy, Carole Suderman and Brenda Fox will be traveling to San Antonio in November – we will be able to take care packages with us! HARVEST OF HOPE (HoH) NEEDS HELP: With the government shutdown, HoH is facing a shortage. They normally feed around 130 families a week – that number is increasing to up to 200+ families in need of help. Join **Dr. Mike Tice**, astrobiologist and member of the Perseverance rover team, for a public presentation and Q&A, Sunday, November 9, 6pm at BMC. He will walk you through the newly announced findings from Jezero Crater showing traces in ancient rocks that may hint at past life.
