

A Moment for All Ages

Gospel Reading

Luke 23.33-43

When they had reached the place called The Skull, they crucified Jesus there—together with the criminals, one on his right and one on his left. And Jesus said, "Abba forgive them. They don't know what they are doing." Then they divided his garments, rolling dice for them.

The people stood there watching. The rulers, however, jeered him and said, "He saved others, let him save himself—if he really is the Anointed of God, the Chosen One!" The soldiers also mocked him. They served Jesus sour wine and said, "If you are really the King of the Judeans, save yourself!" There was an inscription above Jesus that read, "This is the King of the Judeans."

One of the criminals who hung there beside him insulted Jesus, too, saying, "Are you really the Anointed One of God? Then save yourself—and us!"
