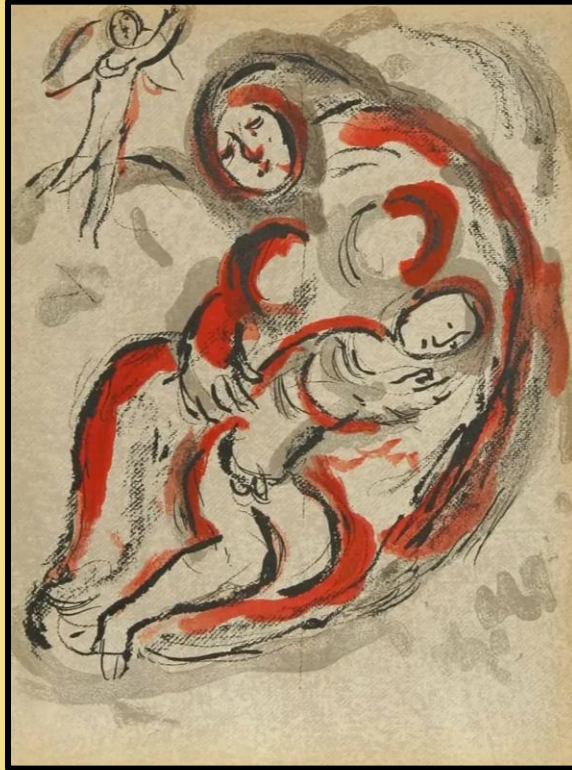

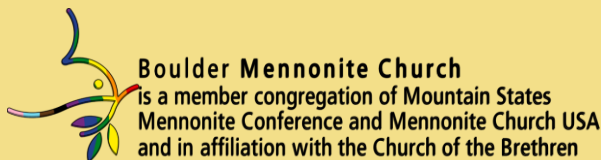

- ~Terry, a visitor last Sunday, asks for prayers for his life and living situation.
- ~ for safe travels and great conversations for the Western Plains Church of the Brethren District Conference July 24-26 in McPherson, Kansas. Sandi Sanborn is our delegate.
- ~ for Palestinian lives. On June 11, the Israeli government was set to approve roughly a billion shekels — about \$338 million — to build out new West Bank settlements. That money moves alongside a new tax law: a 7 percent income-tax break, up to 10,000 shekels a year, for settlers in 58 settlements. Nine demolitions last week destroyed 24 structures and displaced 30 people. Among the dead were an 18-year-old in Beitin and a seven-month-old, shot in his parents' car in Hebron.

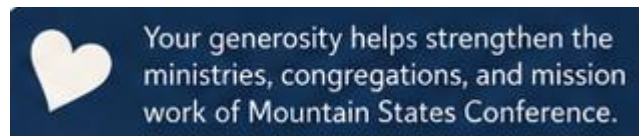
All are invited to attend our Sunday morning worship; there is no registration required to attend Sunday morning! Please join us and plan to stay and purchase lunch at a food truck,

SHARE YOUR STORY TO PROTECT LGBTQ+ EQUALITY IN COLORADO: Rocky Mountain Equality is reaching to learn about the potential impact of the U.S. Supreme Court's upcoming ruling in [St. Mary's Catholic Parish v. Roy](#). This case could result in Colorado's nondiscrimination protections in the universal pre-K program being overturned, potentially allowing some participating schools to deny access to LGBTQ+ families based on a parent's or child's identity. In partnership with Family Equality, we are collecting personal stories to help show what is at stake in this case. Real experiences will demonstrate to the Supreme Court how these policies affect families, children, and communities.
